

COURSE CONDITIONS NOTICE

Darkness, Rain, Fog & Ice

During bad weather or in the event of darkness the fact that the course has not been officially closed does not warrant that it is necessarily fit for play. Therefore Members and Visitors should themselves determine whether they consider it safe to play. This also applies in the event of golfers accessing the course “out of hours” when no Member’s or staff are present.

Players have a duty of care to behave in such a way that they do not injure themselves or injure others by their actions.

All players play at their own risk and should do nothing to jeopardise the safety of themselves or others.

Suspension of Play

Responsibility for discontinuing play rests with the Club Management.

A **Single Prolonged Blast from the Klaxon** signifies **Immediate** Suspension of Play.

Players should mark their balls and return to the Clubhouse **IMMEDIATELY**, without playing any further strokes. They will then be advised how to proceed.

This does not replace a Player’s responsibility for their own safety to discontinue play under Rule 6-8 of the Rules of Golf if they believe there to be a danger from lightning, whether or not any klaxon is sounded.
